

Our 15th Year...

Our little jump-started 15 years ago in the back of our homes. In 2004 seventy people jumped in the lake to raise money for charity. In 2017 there were close to 800 jumpers plus Chilly Chicken's at the State Park, raising over \$160,000 for the Akron Canton Regional Foodbank.

So what has happened in the last 15 years?

Co-founder's Kelly and Heather Pariso, went from dating, to engaged to now going on their 12th wedding anniversary. Two children were brought into the Polar Bear Family. They have learned about giving, donating and volunteering, and in 2017 they both jumped with a group of friends for the first time at ages 8 and 9.

Co-founder's Jeff and Debbie Fulkman have watched their children grow up, move away, and move close to home again. They have welcomed three grandchildren. They love being grandparents and now are enjoying retirement.


As far as the Polar Bear Club itself, we have gone from a "club" to an official Non-Profit 501(c)3. We have outgrown our back yards, then moved to the State Park launch ramps, grew even bigger and are now at the State Park Beach. We started at \$13,000 raised and 70 jumpers in 2004, to over \$160,000 and 800 jumpers in 2017. Technology! From Facebook, to online registration, and online donation we keep updating to keep up with the demands of our growing event.

Most importantly, our love and dedication for the charities, our jumpers, chickens, spectators and amazing volunteers grows every year. 












Akron Rotary Camp



Akron Rotary Camp was founded in 1924 to meet the needs of children with physical disabilities, so kids with polio and cerebral palsy had a place to spend their summers. A place where disabilities and limitations did not matter. A place where they could participate in activities that helped builds their self-esteem and physical endurance. Since its inception, Rotary Camp has been the primary project of the Rotary Club of Akron. Rotarians are active in volunteering and fundraising for Rotary Camp and many

other local and international service projects. In 1995, Rotary Camp formed a successful partnership with the Akron Area YMCA. The YMCA provides professional staff and manages the daily operations of the camp.

Today, the mission of serving children and families is still very much alive in all our programs staying true to providing the opportunity to enjoy the outdoors in a camp setting. Campers are given the opportunity to experience traditional camping activities, develop relationships, learn life skills and create memories that last a lifetime.

Meet Anthony:

13 year old Anthony Harris has been attending Rotary Camp and Respite Camp for five years. He has Attention-Deficit/Hyperactivity Disorder and Oppositional Defiant Disorder. His mother Tiana Sprout said Anthony has impulse control issues and he suffered from separation anxiety after his sister passed away when he was eight years old.



When he started Rotary Camp he began learning how to share. He learned how to take turns. He learned how to solve issues with other children without becoming physical. He became very helpful. With his separation anxiety he would cry when it was camp time.



"But as time passed he was excited for camp and eventually the anxiety became less of an issue for him. He really has a great time and always has a ton of stories when he comes home. Some of the counselors are from other countries so he loves talking and learning about where they are from a well. It really is a great experience for him."



The mission of Akron Rotary Camp is "creating a world where there are only abilities." There are many other campers like Anthony that have the opportunity to do the impossible. Whether it's a first canoe ride, first campfire or the first time away from home, Rotary Camp provides opportunities to help everyone grow.



Donations such as those raised through the Portage Lakes Polar Bear Jump will enable Rotary Camp to continue to strengthen our mission that embraces differences and provides opportunity for children and adults with special needs, regardless of financial background. The generosity of donors makes it possible for us to offer financial assistance to families in need. In 2017, Rotary Camp provided nearly \$200,000 in direct financial assistance to campers and families.


Ronald McPonald House Akron: Keeping Families Close and Comfortable

Like many families, Alexis and Pat Fiocca never imagined they'd find themselves staying at Ronald McDonald House Akron. Yet, when their son Liam needed a stem-cell transplant to treat aplastic anemia, it became their home away from home for more than 100 days.

Prior to arriving at RMHA in August 2016, Liam had endured several months of testing and sickness before doctors identified what was wrong with him. By the time he was diagnosed, he was in liver failure. Liam's only option was a bone marrow transplant. Fortunately, his older sister Talia was a match and felt honored to save his life.

Although the Fioccas and their three children live in





From the moment they walked through the door, Alexis says that they were welcomed with open arms. "Everyone treated us so well and were very hospitable to us," she says. "We didn't have to explain what we were going through to anyone. They were so good to us! We felt right at home."

RMHA made it possible for the Fioccas to spend Thanksgiving, Christmas, and the New Year together while Liam was being treated. Something that might not have happened without RMHA's accommodations.

To help them feel even more at home, the family was allowed to put up a Christmas tree in the downstairs family room and even hosted their family there for the holidays, Alexis shares. Throughout their stay, they ate dinner together every night. Most nights, volunteers made meals for them and other residents, relieving that added stress of meal planning and preparation.

"The mom in me was particularly excited about that because I didn't have to cook," laughs Alexis.

And the longer they were there, the more Liam and his sisters grew to love RMHA. They were all making memories there... and good ones, at that.

As his condition improved, Liam was able to enjoy being a kid again. He waged Nerf gun battles through the hallways with his friends all the time. And, he would race remote-control cars with whomever dared to take him on.



Today, Liam is a healthy, typical seven-year-old boy, who's a lot to keep up with. He's no longer on any medication and is doing well.

"If you saw him now, you'd never know he'd been through what he'd been through," says Alexis.

Liam and his family left RMHA in January 2017, in the midst of the House's expansion project. Alexis and Pat are extremely grateful for all that RMHA did to support and assist them through the darkest time of their lives.

"Everyone there genuinely cares and they take care of every detail," Alexis shares. "Ronald McDonald House will forever hold a special place in our hearts."

paddlers, drummer and steersperson racing in colorful 46'foot Hong Kong style dragonboats. Absolutely no experience is necessary. All ages, genders and skill levels can participate since the key to successful dragon boating is not power, but paddling "in sync."

Create a Team. Gather your co-workers, family and friends to

create your team of 16-24 paddlers and a drummer. Most teams are a mix of men and women. All equipment (boats, paddles, life jackets, a professional steersperson PLUS a practice paddling session on the water prior to race day is included. It's a boatload of fun for less than \$50 per person.



Festival Day Activities. The day starts with a ceremonial "awakening of the dragon." Once the racing begins, it's non-stop action with dragon boats heading to the finish line every 12 minute. The races are fast and furious, typically lasting around two minutes. Paddling with a Purpose. Paddling is the fun part. Sharing a message of hope and supporting breast cancer awareness is the important part. Dragons on the Lake Festival proceeds stay in the community and support all the activities of the Dragon Dream Team including Boatloads of Hope breast cancer outreach, a program in more than 14 hospitals and cancer centers throughout



northeast Ohio.


