



Tech4Good: Connected North on Ice Challenge

2019 Tournament Rules

1. Qualification to Participate

- a) All players participating in the tournament must be properly registered through the Tech4Good(T4G) website. No player may play on more than one team in a tournament.
- b) Any changes made to the roster form must be submitted electronically to the tournament organizer at ddudycha@cisco.com

2. Game Play

- a) All teams must be available to play 10 minutes prior to the scheduled start time.
- b) All players and team officials must sign the game sheet prior to each game.
- c) Any player or team official who is serving a suspension must record that they are serving the suspension on the game sheet in the area where they would normally sign their name.

3. Basic Rules

- a) Teams should change as quickly as possible after the tournament and vacate the dressing rooms within 30 minutes following the tournament
- b) Teams are responsible for cleaning up after themselves and notifying a tournament official or arena staff member if the dressing room needs cleaning.
- c) At Sixteen Mile Sports Complex (SMSC), all players must enter the arena through the Athletes Entrance located on the west side, lower level of the parking lot. Please be advised that for all Oakville Arenas, there is a Town of Oakville policy that forbids any warm-ups in the arena or parking lot. All warm-ups and cool downs must be done in the dressing room.

4. Conduct

- a) The T4G Connected North on Ice Challenge strongly supports the Zero Tolerance Policy against abuse of T4G officials and volunteers.
- b) Any player, team member, team official, or spectator may be asked to leave the playing area or arena premises by a T4G Official.
- c) Due to Municipal and Insurance regulations, at no time are players or spectators allowed on the ice without a helmet. We respectfully request your co-operation and compliance.

d) Decisions of T4G Connected North on Ice Challenge Officials are final.

T4G Connected North on Ice Challenge Code of Conduct

This Code of Conduct identifies the standard of behaviour, which is expected of all tournament participants, including athletes, coaches, parents, directors, volunteers, staff, chaperones and others.

T4G Teams, Associations, Programs and Leagues are committed to providing a sport environment in which all individuals are treated with respect. Participants of the T4G shall conduct themselves at all times in a fair and responsible manner. Participants of the T4G shall conduct themselves at all times in a fair and responsible manner. Members shall refrain from comments or behaviours, which are disrespectful, offensive, abusive, racist or sexist. In particular, behaviour which constitutes harassment, abuse, bullying or cyber-bullying will not be tolerated by the T4G.

During the course of all T4G activities and events, members shall avoid behaviour which brings T4G members or the sport of hockey into disrepute, including but not limited to abusive use of alcohol and non-medical use of drugs. Members shall not use unlawful or unauthorized drugs or narcotics or performance enhancing drugs or methods. Members of the T4G shall not engage in activity or behaviour which endangers the safety of others.

T4G members shall at all times adhere to the T4G Team, Association, Programme and League operational policies and procedures, to rules governing the T4G events and activities and to rules governing any competition in which the member participates on behalf of the T4G. Failure to comply with this Code of Conduct may result in disciplinary action, suspension or release from the tournament.
